


- Status: Under development
- Global: Questions will be included in IOC survey on Status of MSP (November 2024)
- National: Through Rapid Assessment Methodology (RAM), which map priority actions including CD needs









Process



- 31st IOC Assembly: Launched the process to develop a comprehensive framework to deliver knowledge and capacities to meet the needs of IOC Member States for sustainable ocean planning and management.
- **EC-57:** Presentation of Draft IOC Wide-Strategy on Sustainable Ocean Planning and Management (IOC/EC-57/4.3.Doc(1).Rev.)
- Intersessional period: IOC Working Group on Sustainable Ocean Planning and Management (IOC/WG-SOPM) -> Finalise Strategy + Develop Implementation Plan

Draft IOC Wide-Strategy on SOP



Strategic objectives:

- (i) Increased integration and mainstreaming of ocean planning and management
- (ii) Improved observations, data, data frameworks and knowledge management for ecosystem-based management and sectoral applications
- (iii) Strengthened cross-sectoral and transboundary coordination
- (iv) Expanded capacity development
 - Enhance stakeholder capabilities through comprehensive **training programmes**, **workshops**, **information materials and ongoing education**, tailored to meet the needs of diverse users and widely distributed through platforms such as Ocean CD-Hub;
 - Establish **knowledge exchange platforms** to effectively disseminate best practices and innovations, promoting a global community of practice that enables continuous improvement and adaptation of ocean management strategies;
 - Engage with **ECOPs** to foster hands-on learning and leadership in ocean governance and science.
